

From Resistance to Cooperation: What Punishment ("giving consequences") is Really Teaching Our Children

When children misbehave, they are not *being* a problem; they are *having* a problem. When we punish the behavior, we increase their problem and miss the reason for the misbehavior.

In this workshop, parent educator, author, counselor, and child behavior specialist, Bonnie Harris, will show you what punishment does teach and how to gain your child's respect, consideration, and cooperation.

You will learn ways to connect with the root of the behavior, communicate in ways that create healthy boundaries, and use problem solving instead of punishment so children learn to think for themselves, make good decisions, and take responsibility.


Many of the EL2 families were able to attend the field trip to the apple orchard which made it possible for assistant teacher Maggie Sullivan to take some beautiful photos!

Fire Safety

October is National Fire Safety Month. To establish a safe environment, check smoke alarms on every floor and replace batteries once a year if needed. Teach the children if their clothing catches on fire, to stop, drop and roll. Be aware of exit signs, escape routes, and know how to test doors, knobs, frames, and use the back of the hands. Be alert to three fire detection devices: smoke, heat, and flame. Smoke rises, which can make you choke, but cleaner air is closer to the floor, so crawl low. Participate in monthly fire drills. Children with disabilities need easy access to their equipment at all times. Make sure their wheel chairs are easily accessible, and crutches are close by in case of an emergency. ~Alfred A Hughes, Jr.

Check fire extinguishers and know how to use them!

- 1. PULL the pin
- 2. SQUEEZE the trigger
- 3. SWEEP from side to side





Here at Prouty we hold monthly fire drills, usually the alarm is pulled which can be startling and very loud but we also have begun practicing fire drills using verbal commands, such as "Fire Emergency-Evacuate the Building". It is important that we practice both ways because sometimes you see smoke or fire first before you hear the alarm.

The children get in a line with their classroom and walk out the building and around to the trees near the garden. If families are here during a fire drill, please just follow your child's class outside. It really only takes about 2 minutes!
