We are proud to share our 2019 Impact Report. We celebrated 50 years of operations, and over that time the Prouty Center has continually adapted to meet our community's needs.



While the COVID-19 crisis places constraints on providing services in this current environment, our dedicated team is working closely and creatively with hundreds of families throughout Windham County. This includes everything from a one-time phone call to get information about childcare programs for essential personnel through our Child Care Referral service, to vital connections for families seeking housing from our Family Supportive Housing program, to virtual visits from the Early Learning Express bookmobile, to teachers doing circle time and all school sing via Zoom.

During the best of times we receive about 80% of what it takes to deliver services via established funding streams, and we rely on individual and institutional philanthropy for the rest. The COVID-19 crisis has revealed how high-quality childcare is part of the critical infrastructure for our economy, and that we need to invest fully in all young children and their families. Until that day, we will continue to seek the support of our community to help ensure that our youngest citizens have what they need to succeed, which in the long run helps us all be successful.

Thank you for your continued support as we head into our next 50 years.

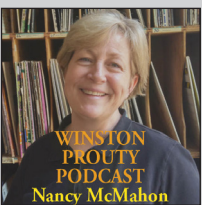
